

INSTRUCTOR PROFILE: JOCELYN EISENLOHR

Classically Trained and Ready to Share It

Jocelyn is a skilled and prolific actor, most recently appearing on the Majestic mainstage as the diabolical Mrs. Cheveley in *An Ideal Husband*, and she's making her triumphant return as Diana in the musical *Next to Normal* through November 17th (so you'd better buy your tickets!). Her extensive training in London and New York provides the basis for ability to impart her considerable experience to the Corvallis community, with a BA in Theatre from University of Texas at Austin, a two-year Diploma in Classical Acting from The London Academy of Performing Arts, and Meisner Training in New York City.

Why is it so important for actors to become comfortable with interacting with text?

"The primary purpose of performing text aloud is to be understood by those listening. If the performer does not clearly grasp what they are saying- or why- they will never be able to clearly convey the text. Actors are constantly interacting with text. It may begin with reading a play prior to an audition. Then, during an audition, you are handed sides of a scene which you may never have laid eyes on before and have 10 minutes to grasp the content before you have to perform it for the auditors. Finally, in performance you must be clear in order to entice the audience into that particular story or verse."

What do you think is the most useful information that can be gleaned from the text of a play?

"Text is a technical starting point for preparing your acting process as well as an underpinning to continue through rehearsals for audience comprehension. Just about any printed word contains clues to guide us toward good Pause, Pace, Pitch, and Projection. The punctuation marks are massive helpers. The pulse of the verse can indicate an intention or clarify the meaning. The proper use of inflection keeps the listeners ears tuned in to you. My goal is to foster confidence in performers to tackle any piece handed to them."
