INSTRUCTOR PROFILE: KRISTINE BERG



A Skilled Artisan Who Deserves Some Props

Kristine Berg has worked professionally in theater, film, and television for over 40 years. Her career began in the prop department at Oregon Shakespeare Festival, and she subsequently worked as a Props Artisan and Props Manager at Berkeley Rep, Long Wharf Theater, Intiman Theater, and Seattle Children's Theater. She has worked as a Specialty Costume Artist and Textile Artist on films and TV series in South Africa, Hungary, Nigeria, Morocco, and the United States, and she has most recently returned to the Oregon Shakespeare Festival as a Costume Crafts Artisan.

What inspired you to become a props artisan?

"I initially studied acting, and was required to do backstage work as part of my studies. I was assigned to do props, and realised that this was what I really wanted to do in the theatre. I've always been good with my hands, and knew that I could probably get more regular employment doing this work than I could as another mediocre actress. I felt confident in my ability to learn and do the work, and excited to learn the skills that would be needed. And it was fun! And I was right.."

What is your favorite prop you've made for a show?


"When I was at Intiman Theater we did a production of Titus Andronicus, and I figured out how to make a knife that would create a bloody line across the actor's neck. It had a bulb of blood hidden in the handle, so the actor could press it while "slitting" the neck of the victim and blood would pour out. Remember: this was all well before the internet, and we had to figure things out for ourselves! At Seattle Children's Theatre we created fake salmon that had ziplock bags that could be opened with a knife and "gutted"; we made the guts out of fish lures and condoms!"

INSTRUCTOR PROFILE: JEFF OLIVER



Passing the Camera to a New Generation

Jeff Oliver is a educator, filmmaker, writer and comedian. He has appeared at the Bridgetown Comedy Festival, on NPR's Tell Me More and once as a question on Wait, Wait...Don't Tell Me. Since 2012 he has been a teaching artist using PBL (Project Based Learning) to create short films with youth, working with numerous organizations in the Portland area. He spent seven summers teaching at Buck's Rock Performing & Creative Arts Camp in New Milford, Connecticut. His documentary about the camp, A Summer To Discover, premiered in 2017.

Did you make films as a teen? What were they like?

"I think I made my first short film in third grade. I played a robot (in a cardboard box) that was programmed to love herring sandwiches. But in my freshman year at Crescent Valley High Video Making class with Don Jepsenmy other teachers into letting me shoot short films instead of writing papers for final projects. I also spent the weekends making short horror films with my friends."


What do you think teens get out of making their own films?

"Filmmaking is always an exercise in creating community. I think making films helps teens understand themselves and others. In the age of social media, teens are constantly surrounded by other people's stories. The School I got really into film when I took a stories tell teens how they should look or talk or feel. But when teens get the chance to Minyard. After that class I talked a few of create their own stories through film, I believe they get the chance to focus on their own values. The final film that emerges is always a community effort that speaks to the values of the whole group."
